Consultation on Wiltshire Council Local Plan 2016-2036

Summary of consultation meeting on rural community planning. Please note a suggestion for the FPC meeting agenda at the end.

I went along to the online rural communities webinar relating to the WC Local Plan 2106-2036. The webinar was based on the document attached (they are my highlights and scribbles on it). I was impressed with the session and the supporting documentation. Key points are captured below. I have little experience of the history of this so it might be that you, the reader, are well ahead of me.

- The consultation is open to March 9th
- The attached document has some key questions that WC welcome input on in particular
- The Local Plan identifies where and how housing developments take place in line with government policy. It updates the Core Strategy extending the plan period from 2016 to 2036 (originally 2026)
- The Empowering Rural Communities document (attached) is about meeting local housing needs in Local Service Centres, Large Villages and Small Villages
- For the first time there will be a specified housing allocation for EVERY LSC and Large Village
- WC wants planning to be managed locally through Neighbourhood Plans - **there was a very strong emphasis on the importance of having a Neighbourhood plan**
- In the absence of a neighbourhood plan it is possible that WC might impose a site allocation for market housing on a village to ensure that housing targets are met
- Fovant is in the Salisbury Housing Market Area (HMA) (other HMAs are Chippenham, Swindon, Trowbridge)
- Salisbury HMA's rural areas is required to have 2540 new houses to 2036, 880 of them in Large Village
- Fovant as a Large Village has an annualised baseline housing requirement of 1.5 meaning an INDICATIVE housing requirement of 30 in the period 2016 to 2036. Already built or planned account for 7 so, as things stand 23 more to build. Note that this indicative and WC are looking to understand how to translate that to an 'actual' figure (item 78 onwards in attached).
- Additional key factors in the Local Plan are climate change issues and a net increase in biodiversity.
